

Student Satisfaction Survey 2020-2021


Government Arts College (Autonomous), Salem -636007 is highly committed to provide quality education to the students who are mainly from rural background. Educating the students with this background creates many challenges and we are committed to face these challenges in an effective manner. To ensure continuous improvement, the requirements of the students have to be carefully identified for which we use the mechanism of obtaining the feedback. This survey is done every academic year with a sample of around 928 students.

The IQAC of this college took the lead in conducting the Student Satisfaction Survey on-line in March 2021 with the assistance of Academic staff. The survey results were electronically tabulated and printed by IQAC for analysis and for continual improvement to processes and systems. The analysis was compiled into a survey report which was submitted to the management council for review and approval prior to implementation of recommended improvement actions. Survey report was made available to stakeholders after management approval and it is uploaded in the college web portal.


The SSS survey was done online through using Google forms. Hence this digitalized process is Green and Automatic. The online mode of data collection ensures speedy acquisition of information and also prompt analysis. This sample survey which is done with a sample of 928 students, will be extended to the process of Complete Enumeration in future. 


Degree Program Pursuing




Branch Pursuing




1. How much of the curricula and syllabi are covered in the subject in which you are studying?




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?




3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?




4.The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications




5.Do the teachers build-up in you the expected curricular competencies, programme outcomes and programme specific outcomes?




6.Does your mentor do necessary follow up of the tasks assigned to you?




7.To what extent the mentoring process in your institution is beneficial to you for cognitive, social and emotional growth?




8.What percentage of teachers uses ICT-enabled methods like multimedia, web-based learning and national e-resources while teaching




9.Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.




10. What is the extent of opportunities given to you for outdoor learning like internship, student exchanges, field visits and projects?




11. What is the level of opportunities provided by your institution to develop employability and entrepreneurship skills to prepare you for your career?




12. What level of monitoring and evaluation is available in your institution for assessing the effectiveness and interactivity of the classroom/learning sessions?




13.To what extent the institutional ambience and class room teaching has improved your creative thinking and analytical skills?




14.How frequently your performance in academic assignments are discussed and reviewed with you by the teachers?




15.What is your assessment about the fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers?









FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

STUDENTS SATISFACTION SURVEY REPORT (2020 -2021)

The feedback process is effectively used as a mechanism to identify the following:

1. The effectiveness of key areas should be retained and enhanced.
2. The opportunities for continuous improvement.

These generally revealed that students were highly satisfied with their study experiences in this sesquicentennial institution of Tamil Nadu.

STRENGTHS OF THE INSTITUTION

- Around 84% of the students agree that the syllabus coverage is very good.
- More than 92% of the respondents agree that the teachers deliver the courses with their thorough preparation
- Around 83% of the students represents that the teachers communicate effectively
- More than 85% of the respondents agree that the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.
- More than 85% agree that usually the teachers build up expected curricular competencies, program outcomes and program specific outcomes.
- More than 90% agree that the mentors usually follow up the tasks assigned to the students.

- Around 80% of the students agree that the mentoring process is beneficial for cognitive, social and emotional growth.
- Around 90% of the teachers use ICT enabled methods of teaching like multimedia, web based learning and e-resources for teaching.
- Around 90% of the students agree that the efforts made by the teachers to inculcate soft skills and employability skills are excellent.
- 77% given to the extent of opportunities for outdoor learning like internships, student exchanges, field visits and projects.
- 85% opportunities provided to develop employability and entrepreneurship skills to prepare for students' careers.
- 86% monitoring and evaluation is available in the institution for assessing the effectiveness and interactivity of the classroom/learning sessions.
- Around 94% of the students are happy with the institutional ambience and class room teaching.
- Around 95% of the students agree that the academic assignments are discussed and reviewed often by the teachers.
- More than 90% of the students have an opinion that the internal assessment is fair.
- Around 91% of students gave their opinion that within 45 days the Institution is declaring the semester examination results
- 91% of students agree about the available mechanisms (issue of photocopy of answer sheet, re-totalling, re-evaluation and provision of grace marks) in the institution for redressal of grievances with reference to examinations.
- Around 94% of the students are satisfied with the examination process.
- 90% teachers enable students to identify strengths and weaknesses and help to develop student strengths and overcome weaknesses by providing timely counselling and care.
- Around 90% of the students feel that the award rating is excellent.
- The students' feedback reveals that the teachers identify the strength and weakness of the students through effective monitoring.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR IMPROVEMENT

The following are the thrust areas of improvement as revealed by the feedback. Even though the percentage of students who say that some areas require improvement is very less (around 10%), we perceive this as potential areas for continuous improvement.

- Though 85% percent of students are happy with the mentoring process, 10% have neutral opinions and 5% feel that the process requires improvement.
- Though 87% of the students are satisfied with the usage of modern teaching methods, 10% have the neutral opinion and 3% of the students feel that more ICT-enabled methods should be used.
- 90% of the students appreciate the opportunities provided to them in terms of internship, student exchanges, field visits and projects, 7% have neutral opinions and 3% feel that more opportunities for outdoor learning should be provided.
- 87% of the students feel that the level of opportunities provided by the institution to develop employability and entrepreneurship skills are excellent, 10% of the students have neutral opinions and 3% feel that more orientation is required.
- 90% of the students rate the level of monitoring and evaluation of the effectiveness of the classroom/learning sessions as very high, but 8% have a neutral opinion and 2% feel that more orientation is required.
- 87% of the students feel that the mentoring process is beneficial for cognitive, social and emotional growth, but 10% have a neutral opinion and 3% feel that the more opportunities should be provided.

From this exclusive survey, around 90% of the students responded that they were highly satisfied with the services rendered by the College. With the implementation of the improvement actions identified in this survey, we will be expecting better results in next Academic year 2021 – 2022.
