Government Arts College(Autonomous), Salem-7 COE Office Annual Report – 2021-22

The Controller of Examination (COE) Office acts as a heart of an Autonomous Institution. COE office of Government Arts College(Autonomous), Salem-7 is functioning for conducting examinations, evaluating the answer scripts, publishing results, printing and issue of mark statements, apply for provisional and degree certificates to University. Apart from examination related activities, COE office is responsible for conducting Board of studies meetings, Academic Council meetings and Governing Body Meetings.

I. CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

- The curriculum of 2021-2022 is designed for all UG and PG programmes following UGC, TANSCHE and Periyar University guidelines and having minimum 75% similarity with the TANSCHE norms based on the guidelines from Faculty Development Programme on "Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Design – Steps and Strategies" organized by Curriculum Development Cell on 17-03-2021.
- Boards of Studies meeting of various departments were conducted from 3-2-2021 to 10-02-2021 regarding new curriculum and syllabi for academic year 2021-2022.

Highlights of newly designed curriculum

i) The following three non-credits Self-study **Research Acumen courses** are introduced in all PG Courses.

- ii) An **Interdisciplinary course** is introduced in the 3rd semester of PG Courses. Any two departments can collaboratively offer a common course with 50:50 ratio of content from respective subjects to promote interdisciplinary teaching –learning.
- iii) A mandatory enrollment in a **Swayam/NTPL course** for all PG students in the entire course duration. The course selected shall be relevant to his/her subject approved by HOD.
- iv) **Extra credits (2 credits/course)** for completing additional **Swayam** courses shall be awarded.
- v) Two **Communicative English** papers are introduced in Semester I and II of all UG programmes replacing Foundation English papers as per the directions of TANSCHE.
- vi) **Professional English** courses are introduced in I and II semesters of all UG Programmes with Two credits each.
- vii) **Practical Course on Film and Literature** (21PELP1) with 40 marks for Internal Assessment and 60 marks for External Examination is introduced.
- viii) The Allied Mathematics Paper III offered by the Department of Mathematics is modified as a practical paper in the new syllabus.
- ix) The **Internship for I M.Sc Geology** is added as a mandatory component in the new syllabus.
- Four self -study Elective courses with 2 credits in Semester III of UG under Part V Extension Activities are introduced.

II. **EXAMINATION**

The Theory Examinations shall be of three hours duration conducted at the end of each semester. The maximum mark for each theory course is 100.

The candidate failing to get the minimum marks required for passing in any course shall be permitted to appear for each failed subject(s) in the subsequent semesters.

The Practical Examinations shall be conducted at the end of even semesters with the duration of three hours.

Assignment Component

Maximum marks for theory courses in assignment component are 10. The three assignments (Maximum 5 marks for each) have to be submitted for each theory course. The marks of best two assignments shall be added and awarded for the assignment component in CIA.

Test Component

Maximum marks for theory courses in test component are 10. The average marks of CIA test 1(Out of 5) and CIA test2(Out of 5) shall be added with Model test mark(Out of 5) and awarded to test component for each theory course.

Maximum marks for practical courses in test component are 15. The average marks of CIA test 1(Out of 5) and CIA test2(Out of 5) shall be added with Model test mark(Out of 10) and awarded to test component for each practical course.

Observation and Record

The observation note book maintained properly shall be awarded 15 marks maximum. The marks for record note shall be 10 and included in semester practical examination. Submission of practical record notebooks with proper bona fide certificate duly signed by the Staff in charge prior to the Main practical examination is mandatory for the award for record notebook marks. Candidates who do not submit their record notebooks on time will be awarded zero (0) marks.

IV. QUESTION PATTERN

The question pattern for theory courses shall be as follows:

Duration of examination: 3 Hours

Maximum Marks: 75

Part A: 15x 1 = 15 Marks

15 Questions (Answer all the questions) (Three questions from each unit)

Part B: 2 x 5 = 10 Marks

5 Questions (Answer any Two questions) (One question from each unit)

Part C: 5 x 10 = 50 Marks

5 Questions (Answer all the questions) (One question will be set from each unit with internal choice)

The question pattern for practical courses shall be as follows:

Duration of examination: 3 Hours

Maximum Marks: 60

No. of questions = 2 (without internal choice)

No. of experiments 2 x 25 = 50 Marks Record = 10 Marks

Total Marks = 60 Marks

V. REVALUATION

Revaluation of Theory courses, Re-totaling of marks, supplementary and instant examination, and transparency of Theory courses are allowed as per Government Arts College (Autonomous), Salem-7 Examination Guidelines.

Candidates need to apply to the Controller the Examinations, through the Principal with proper endorsement and recommendation by the Head of the department concerned.



The candidate has to apply and re-appear for the practical examination at the subsequent even semester only.




